DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Paisley House is a substantial two-story residence which stands at a strategic location adjacent to the entrance of Winston-Salem State University. The house is three bays wide over a brick foundation laid in four course common bond and is sheathed in wood shingles. Perhaps the most striking feature of the Paisley House is the use of clipped gable roofs and dormers, a bold turn-of-the-century form. The fenestration of the house is a varied combination of eight-over-one, six-over-one, four-over-one, and four-over-four sash windows set in plain board surrounds. Two-over-two casement windows light the basement on the east elevation. The massing of the house consists of a main block with a projecting clipped gable break centered in the west elevation which contains the stair hall, and a flanking recessed porch, and a breaking extension of the east elevation which is initiated by a clipped gable second story projection. An exterior chimney laid in common bond abuts the northern end of the break in the east elevation. A second brick chimney pierces the southwest portion of the roof. The facade is dominated by a deep clipped gable above a wall which is distinguished by the texture of the wood shingle sheathing. A porch is recessed behind a series of three arches on the facade and single arches on the east and west elevations. Leading from the porch, the front door is composed of six lights over a flat panel.

The interior of the Paisley House is sheathed in plaster and features simple molded surrounds and wide, heavy baseboards. A brick fireplace and chimney breast with an arched opening dominates the east wall of the living room. The first floor rooms are arranged two rooms deep with a stair hall between the west rooms. The closed string stair has a heavy square newel post and square balusters and rises through two quarter-turns to a second floor central stair hall. The second floor rooms, arranged around the north, east, and south sides of the stair hall, display similar woodwork.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

In spite of the success of the fund-raising efforts conducted by J. H. Hill, Dr. S. G. Atkins realized that the Slater Industrial Academy would not survive unless a faculty made up of qualified professional teachers could be recruited. Part of his efforts to assemble a competent faculty were directed toward the establishment of the Columbian Heights neighborhood which he envisioned as an inducement for prospective teachers. One of the most outstanding teachers to be recruited by Atkins and one who obviously benefited from the presence of the Columbian Heights community was John W. Paisley.

Paisley was a graduate of Shaw University, and perhaps because he was a native of Winston-Salem, he chose to return to the city sometime between 1908 and 1910 to teach in Dr. Atkins' school. In 1910 Paisley purchased a lot on Idabell Avenue near J. S. Hill's home and shortly thereafter a house was built on the site. Although Hill left the Slater faculty in 1913, he was a resident of the Columbian Heights community for the rest of his life. During the remainder of his career, Paisley served the city school system first as principal of the Oak Street Grade School for thirteen years and then as the principal of the Kimberly Park School where he completed his educational career.






